

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 199 of 1937.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following regulations:—

(1) High Commissioner's Notice No. 89 of 1930 shall be and is hereby cancelled.

(2) Whenever any goods imported into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from Southern Rhodesia or Northern Rhodesia, not being the growth, produce or manufacture of Southern Rhodesia or Northern Rhodesia as the case may be, are subsequently dispatched or supplied by any person in the Bechuanaland Protectorate for removal from the Territory to and for consumption in the Union of South Africa, such person shall furnish a "Notice" (in the Form A in the Schedule hereto annexed) wherein shall be set forth the name and address of the person to whom the goods are to be consigned, the mode of conveyance, the marks, numbers and description of the packages, the description, net quantities and values of the contents at the place of dispatch and the name of the country where the goods were grown, produced or manufactured, sufficient to enable the duties, if any, paid or payable thereon to be assessed, and such person shall also frame an Advice (in the Form B in the Schedule annexed hereto) which shall agree in all particulars with the relative Notice and at the same time shall pay to the nearest Customs Officer, District Commissioner of the Bechuanaland Protectorate or other prescribed person any difference in duty due by the purchaser of the goods in terms of sub-section (a) of section one of Proclamation No. 66 of 1937.

(3) Whenever any goods imported into the Bechuanaland Protectorate being the growth, produce or manufacture of Southern Rhodesia or Northern Rhodesia are subsequently dispatched or supplied by any person in the Bechuanaland Protectorate for removal from the Territory to and for consumption in the Union of South Africa, such person shall furnish a Declaration (in the Form C in the Schedule annexed hereto) wherein shall be set forth the name and address of the person to whom the goods are to be consigned, the mode of consignment, the marks, numbers and description of the packages, the description, net quantities and values of the contents at the place of dispatch and the name of the country where the goods were grown, produced or manufactured sufficient to enable the duties payable thereon to be assessed and such person shall also frame an Advice (in the Form D in the Schedule hereto annexed) which shall agree in all particulars with the relative declaration and at the same time shall pay to the nearest Customs Officer, District Commissioner of the Bechuanaland Protectorate or other prescribed person any duty due by the purchaser of the goods in terms of sub-section (b) of section one of Proclamation No. 66 of 1937.

(4) In the case of goods imported into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from Southern Rhodesia or Northern Rhodesia and subsequently removed to the Union, the following procedure shall apply respectively in the case of goods forwarded (a) by post, (b) by rail or (c) otherwise than by post or rail.

If any duties be payable on the goods in terms of sub-section (a) or (b) of section one of Proclamation No. 66 of 1937, the Notice or Declaration as the case may be shall be first presented to the nearest Customs Officer, District Commissioner of the Bechuanaland Protectorate or other prescribed person, for collection of such duties and endorsement accordingly. Thereafter the following procedure shall apply:—

- (a) In the case of such goods sent by post a form (in the Form E in the Schedule hereto annexed) may be substituted for the Notice or Declaration as the case may be. The consignor shall hand the form in to the Post Office with the goods and the Postal Authorities shall transmit the form to the Union Customs Officer, Mafeking.
- (b) In the case of such goods forwarded by rail the Notice or Declaration as the case may be shall be handed to the Railway Authorities who shall after dispatch of the goods forward it to the Union Customs Officer, Mafeking, and the Advice B or D as the case may be, shall be transmitted or delivered to the consignee, and no such goods shall be dispatched by the Railway Authorities until such Notice or Declaration is supplied.
- (c) In the case of such goods conveyed otherwise than by post or rail the Notice or Declaration as the case may be shall be sent direct to the Union Customs Officer, Mafeking, by the consignor. The Advice B or D as the case may be shall be handed to the carrier or other person conveying the goods to be by him handed to the consignee to be dealt with by him as directed in the Customs Regulations.
