

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 89 of 1937.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

CUSTOMS; ORDINARY DUMPING DUTY ON
RUBBER HOSE.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *fifteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that from and after the ninth day of April, 1937, there shall be charged, levied, collected and paid on rubber hose of all kinds (armoured or plain) on importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the United States of America an "ordinary" dumping duty equal to the difference between the "export price" as defined in section *nineteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, and the "domestic value" thereof, as defined in that section, plus the extra cost of packing and packages for export, carriage to port of shipment and all other expenses incidental to placing such goods on board ship ready for export to the Bechuanaland Protectorate, provided—

- (a) that such difference is greater than five per centum of the export price, and
- (b) that such duty, together with any other duty imposed in terms of sub-section (1) of section *fifteen* of the above-mentioned Proclamation shall not exceed one-half of the value of the rubber hose for duty purposes, as defined in section *fourteen* of that Proclamation, and
- (c) that such dumping duty shall not be imposed in respect of rubber hose shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the United States of America prior to the above-mentioned date.

High Commissioner's Notice No. 61 of 1924 is hereby cancelled.
