

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 92 OF 1937.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

CUSTOMS: SALES DUMPING DUTY ON  
RUBBER HOSE.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *fifteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended. His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that from and after the ninth day of April, 1937, there shall be charged, levied, collected and paid on rubber hose of all kinds (armoured or plain) on importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the United States of America a "sales" dumping duty equal to the difference between the selling price in the Bechuanaland Protectorate and the domestic value thereof plus the extra cost of packing and packages for export, inland carriage, sea freight, insurance and all charges to the port of entry in the Bechuanaland Protectorate, including landing, transportation and delivery charges and any duty (other than a dumping duty) payable under the above-mentioned Proclamation or any amendment thereof, provided—

- (a) that such duty, together with any other duty imposed in terms of sub-section (1) of section *fifteen* of the above-mentioned Proclamation shall not exceed one-half of the value of the rubber hose for duty purposes, as defined in section *fourteen* of the said Proclamation, and
- (b) that such dumping duty shall not be imposed in respect of rubber hose shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the United States of America prior to the above-mentioned date.

High Commissioner's Notice No. 62 of 1924 is hereby cancelled.
