

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

No. 7 of 1937.

(Promulgated 19th February, 1937.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner

Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Medical, Dental and Pharmacy (Amendment) Proclamation, 1937.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Medical, Dental and Pharmacy Proclamation 1934 (No. 62 of 1934) hereinafter referred to as the principal law;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

I. Section *six* of the principal law shall be and is hereby amended by—

- (a) the repeal of the words “ a fee of five pounds in the case of a medical practitioner, two pounds ten shillings in the case of a dentist or chemist and one pound in the case of a nurse or midwife ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ a fee of one pound in the case of a medical practitioner or dentist, and ten shillings in the case of a chemist, nurse or midwife ”;
- (b) the repeal of the words “ at the date of the taking effect of this Proclamation is holding a Government appointment in the territory or is practising ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ is the holder of a Government appointment in the territory or at the date of the taking effect of this Proclamation is practising ”.

This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Medical, Dental and Pharmacy (Amendment) Proclamation, 1937, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
