HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE

No. 175 OF 1938.

CUSTOMS.

DUMPING DUTY ON CERTAIN IRON AND
STEEL PRODUCTS FROM THE UNITED
STATES OF AMERICA.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *fifteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation No. 20 of 1925, as amended, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that, from and after the fourteenth day of October, 1938, there shall be charged, levied, collected and paid on the undermentioned iron and steel products, namely—

- (a) rounds, including reinforcing rods, under 3 inches in diameter;
- (b) plates within the following dimensions, including non-rectangular plates, if the smallest rectangle from which they can be cut falls within the said dimensions—
 - (i) plates from 12 inches to 18 inches inclusive in width and $\frac{1}{8}$ inch and over in thickness;
 - (ii) plates over 18 inches wide which are $\frac{1}{8}$ inch and over but under $\frac{3}{16}$ inch in thickness;
- (c) galvanised corrugated sheets;
- (d) galvanised flat sheets 4 inches and over in width and under $\frac{1}{8}$ inch in thickness, including non-rectangular flat sheets, if the smallest rectangle from which they can be cut falls within the said dimensions,

on importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the United States of America, an "ordinary" dumping duty as defined in paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section *fifteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, provided that—

- (a) such dumping duty shall not exceed one-half of the value of the goods for duty purposes as defined in section *fourteen* of the said Proclamation, and
- (b) such dumping duty shall not be imposed in respect of such goods shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the United States of America prior to the above-mentioned date.
