HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE

No. 199 OF 1938.

CUSTOMS.

DUMPING DUTY ON RUBBER PNEUMATIC
TYRES AND TUBES FROM THE UNITED
STATES OF AMERICA AND FROM CANADA.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *fifteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that, from and after the ninth day of December, 1938, there shall be charged, levied, collected and paid on rubber pneumatic tyres and tubes, on importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the United States of America and from Canada, an "ordinary" dumping duty equal to the difference between the export price as defined in section *nineteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, and the domestic value as defined in that section, plus the extra cost of packing and packages for export, carriage to the port of shipment, and all other expenses incidental to placing the goods on board ship ready for exportation to the Bechuanaland Protectorate, provided that—

- (a) such dumping duty shall be reduced by an amount computed on the weight of such tyres and tubes at 2d. per lb. in the case of importations from the United States of America, and 6d. per lb. in the case of importations from Canada;
- (b) such dumping duty shall not exceed one-half of the value of the goods for duty purposes as defined in section *fourteen* of the said Proclamation, and
- (c) such dumping duty shall not be imposed in respect of such goods shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the United States of America and from Canada prior to the above-mentioned date.
