

## BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

### PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER  
Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Licensing  
(Amendment) Proclamation, 1938.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Proclamation dated the 4th April, 1892 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Proclamation"), which regulates the sale of intoxicating liquors in the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Section *twenty-three* of the said Proclamation is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

Amendment of Section 23 of Proclamation of 4th April, 1892.

"23. The Resident Commissioner, on the written recommendation of the District Commissioner of the district, may, if he is satisfied that it will be for the benefit and convenience of the public so to do, grant authority to the holder of any retail licence within such district to supply (a) between 12 noon and 1 p.m. and between 5.30 p.m. and 7 p.m. on Sunday, Christmas Day or Good Friday, to any person a reasonable quantity of liquor to be consumed in such premises other than the Bar (which shall remain closed to the public all day) as are stipulated in such authority; or (b) on Sunday, Christmas Day or Good Friday, to any person who takes and pays for a *bona fide* lunch or dinner a reasonable quantity of liquor to be consumed at such meal."

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Proclamation, 1938, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
