PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner.

Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Licence Duties
(Blacksmiths) Amendment Proclamation, 1938.

Whereas it is expedient further to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Licence Duties (Blacksmiths) Proclamation, 1929 (No. 47 of 1929), hereinafter referred to as "the principal law";

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

Repeal. 1. Proclamation No. 4 of 1931 is hereby repealed.

New section inserted in the principal law. 2. The following new section, numbered 4A, is hereby inserted immediately after section *four* of the principal law:—

4A. (1) Nothing in this Proclamation shall apply to a native approved of by the District Commissioner of the district concerned (such approval to be in writing and to be produced on demand) who is domiciled in the Bechuanaland Protectorate and is carrying on the trade of a blacksmith within the Reserve of his tribe, provided that no person other than a native is connected with or has any interest in or is employed by or about such blacksmith's business.

(2) For the purposes of this section "native" means any aboriginal native belonging to any tribe of Africa, and includes any person of mixed race living as a member of any native community, tribe, kraal or location in the Bechuanaland Protectorate.

Short title and commencement. 3. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Licence Duties (Blacksmiths) Amendment Proclamation, 1938, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
