HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 175 of 1939.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by Regulation 17 (4) of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Defence Regulations, 1939 (High Commissioner's Notice No. 150 of 1939), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following Rules relating to the manner in which objections against an order of the Resident Commissioner may be made to the Advisory Committee appointed in terms of Regulation 17 (2):—

1. An objection to an order made by the Resident Commissioner under the provisions of Regulation 17 (1) may be lodged with the Advisory Committee within thirty days after the date of such order.
2. Every such objection shall be in writing and shall specify in detail the grounds of the objection.
3. Within ten days after the receipt by the Advisory Committee of such objection the Advisory Committee shall consider the objection, and for that purpose the objector may appear before such Advisory Committee either in person or by counsel, solicitor or agent.
4. Evidence under oath may be led by the objector or by any other person in support of such objection.
