

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 208 of 1940.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *two* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Diseases of Stock Proclamation, 1926 (No. 4 of 1926), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following addition to the Regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 28 of 1926:—

“ 93. DOURINE.

The following additional provisions shall apply in the case of dourine:—

Any equine suspected of suffering from dourine may be tested by order of the Chief Veterinary Officer, and any animal that reacts to the test or shows clinical symptoms of the disease may be **treated or operated** upon in such manner as may be directed by the Chief Veterinary Officer, or may be destroyed by his order; and for the proper carrying out of this measure the Chief Veterinary Officer shall have power to call in the assistance of the police who shall on written instructions from him carry out the destruction of the animal.”
