PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The High Commissioner
Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Sleeping
Sickness (Amendment) Proclamation, 1941.

Whereas it is deemed expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Sleeping Sickness Proclamation, 1939, hereinafter referred to as "the principal law":

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

Amendment of section 9 of Proclamation No. 28 of 1939. 1. Sub-section (1) of section *nine* of the principal law is hereby amended by adding, immediately after paragraph (i), the following paragraph:—

“(j) directing persons using vehicular transport along any specified roads to submit their vehicles to disinfestation at specified smudge huts along the route and limiting the size of the loads which may be carried on such vehicles.”

Short title and commencement. 2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Sleeping Sickness (Amendment) Proclamation, 1941, and shall have force and effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
