PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner
Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Medical,
Dental and Pharmacy (Amendment) Procla-
mation, 1941.

Whereas it is expedient further to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Medical, Dental and Pharmacy Proclamation, 1934, hereinafter referred to as "the principal law":

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Section *nine* of the principal law is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

New section 9 as Proclamation No. 42 of 1934.

9. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Proclamation, any member of any recognised missionary society certified as such by the District Commissioner of the district in which such member resides shall be permitted, without being registered as provided in this Proclamation, to prescribe and dispense drugs and to render medical and surgical aid, provided that—

(a) such member has been certified by the Principal Medical Officer as possessing the requisite qualifications or knowledge to prescribe and dispense drugs and to render such medical and surgical aid;

(b) such member shall supply such drugs and render such medical and surgical aid without any fee or reward exceeding one shilling for each supply of drugs.

(2) For the purposes of this section, the drugs which may be prescribed or dispensed by a member of a missionary society shall not include any poison named in or added to Part I or Part II of Schedule C of this Proclamation.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Medical, Dental and Pharmacy (Amendment) Proclamation, 1941, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
