PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The High Commissioner
Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Mines and
Minerals (Amendment) Proclamation, 1941.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Mines and Minerals Proclamation, 1932, hereinafter referred to as "the principal law":

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal law the High Commissioner may at any time extend the time for payment of any royalties, rentals, licence fees, or any tributes or dues of whatsoever nature payable to or claimable by the Crown under the provisions of the principal law, or may in his discretion waive all claim to any such royalties, rentals, licence fees, tributes or dues or to any portion thereof.

Power to postpone or waive royalties, rentals, etc., payable under Proclamation No. 32 of 1932.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Mines and Minerals (Amendment) Proclamation, 1941, and shall be deemed to have had force and effect as from the twenty-first day of November, 1940.
