CONTROL OF IMPORTS—RESTRICTED COMMODITIES.

It is hereby notified for general information that as from the date of publication of this Notice in the *Gazette*, and until further notice, no permits will be issued for the importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate of any of the articles set forth in the Annexure to this Notice unless such articles have been grown, produced or manufactured in, and are imported from, any part of the British Commonwealth other than Canada and Newfoundland.
