

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.  
RESIDENT COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 9 of 1941.  
PREVENTION OF THE SPREAD OF  
SLEEPING SICKNESS.

Under the powers in me vested by section *nine* (1) (a) of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Sleeping Sickness Proclamation, 1939 (No. 28 of 1939), I do hereby order that protective clearings under the supervision of the Tsetse fly and Trypanosomiasis officer shall be made within the Sleeping Sickness Area as defined by High Commissioner's Notice No. 68 of 1940, in the following localities:—

- (1) *Gwedau*.—On the west bank of the Taoghe River near Lediba ya Dikubu, in the forest islands between the Tsetse Survey Camp and the River. The protective clearing to be over a semi-circle of approximately one-half mile radius round the Gwedau Ford on the Taoghe River on the Ngamiland Waterways Road 26 miles from Tsau.
- (2) *Makola*.—6 Miles from the Toteng Drift on the Toteng Nxaragha-Maun road. The protective clearing to be diamond-shaped, with the following boundaries: from a point one-half mile north of the present Survey Camp at Makola along a straight line to a point one-quarter of a mile east of the Camp and thence along a straight line to a point one-half mile south of the Camp; thence in a straight line to a point 7 miles west of the Camp, at the big Baobab tree known as Stigand's Baobab; thence in a straight line back to the starting point.
- (3) *Marophe*.—On the old Nxaragha-Gwexga wagon road in the Mopane forest belt. The protective clearing to be in a semi-circle around Nakedi's Corner with a radius of approximately one-quarter of a mile and an area one-quarter mile square in the patch of dense vegetation near Gabarasia.
- (4) *Nxaragha*.—Certain forest islands to the north-west of the Toteng-Nxaragha-Maun old motor road, lying round the Nxaragha "Mochaba Tree", 26 miles from Toteng and 26 miles from Maun.
