HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE

No. 126 of 1942

It is hereby notified for general information that under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following amendment in the Bechuanaland Protectorate Defence Regulations, 1939 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 150 of 1939:—

Regulation 43 of the principal Regulations, as amended by High Commissioner's Notice No. 98 of 1940 and by High Commissioner's Notice No. 124 of 1942, is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following paragraph, numbered (3):—

"(3) (a) Where an alien is in custody, having been arrested or detained in the exercise of any power conferred by these Regulations, any person authorised by the Resident Commissioner to act under this paragraph may take all such steps as may be reasonably necessary for photographing, measuring and otherwise identifying the alien.

(b) The photographs to be taken may include a photograph of the full face, a photograph of the true profile and a full-length photograph.

(c) The measurements to be taken may include—

his height when standing;

the size and relative position of every scar and distinctive mark upon any part of his body and

the external filament of the fingers and thumbs of both hands—to be taken by pressing them first upon an ink plate, and then upon paper or cardboard, so as to have a clear print of the skin surface."
