

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 15 of 1942.

It is hereby notified for general information that under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *two* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Diseases of Stock Proclamation, 1926 (No. 4 of 1926), as amended by Proclamation No. 4 of 1937, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to cancel Regulation 55 of the Regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 230 of 1939 and to substitute therefor the following Regulation:—

" 55. No person shall ~~move~~ or cause or allow to be removed any ~~livestock~~ from any of the areas defined in the Schedule hereunder except under a permit to be granted by an official of the Veterinary Department or such other person as may be authorised by the Chief Veterinary Officer to issue such permits, and such official or person may impose such conditions as he may consider necessary."

SCHEDULE.

- (1) The Barolong Farms as defined in Schedule B" of Proclamation No. 1 of 1896 and Crown Lands south of the Bangwaketse Reserve and east of the meridian 24 degrees 15 minutes east longitude.
- (2) The Lobatsi Block as defined in the Schedule to Proclamation No. 4 of 1905.
- (3) The Bangwaketse Reserve as defined in section *five* of Proclamation No. 9 of 1899 as amended by Proclamation No. 55 of 1908.
- (4) The Bamalete Reserve as defined in Schedule A of Proclamation No. 1 of 1896.
- (5) The Gaborones District as defined in section *six* of High Commissioner's Notice No. 119 of 1923, including the Batlokwa Reserve, but excluding the Bakgatla and the Bamalete Reserves.
- (6) The Bakwena Reserve as defined in section *four* of Proclamation No. 9 of 1899 as amended by Proclamation No. 55 of 1908.
- (7) The Bakgatla Reserve as defined in section *three* of Proclamation No. 9 of 1899.
- (8) The Tuli Block as defined in the Schedule to Proclamation No. 13 of 1905.
- (9) The area bounded on the west by the section of railway running from Foley Siding to Topsis Siding; thence by a line running north of Serule Hill, north of Kgagoda and north of Mogapinyane, to the Tsokwane River, along the Tsokwane River to

its junction with the Lotsani River, down the Lotsani River to its point of intersection with the western boundary of the Tuli Block and along this boundary in a northerly direction to its point of intersection with the common boundary of the Bechuanaland Protectorate and Southern Rhodesia: thence along the said common boundary to the junction of the Shashi and Ramaquabane Rivers, and up the Shashi River to a point two miles east of Kgari Macheng village: thence southwards to where the Matabele or Pioneer Road first meets the Macloutsie River; thence up the Macloutsie River to the point of commencement at Foley Siding.

(10) The area bounded on the south-east by that part of the north-western boundary of area 9 running between Foley Siding and the Shashi River; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of the Tati Territory as defined by section one of Proclamation No. 2 of 1911 to its point of intersection with the western boundary of Southern Rhodesia; thence in a north-westerly direction along the western boundary of Southern Rhodesia to its point of intersection with the boundary of the Ngamiland and Chobe District as defined in High Commissioner's Notice No. 79 of 1938; thence westwards along latitude 19 degrees south to its point of intersection with longitude 25 degrees east; thence southwards along this meridian to its point of intersection with latitude 20 degrees south; thence direct to beacon No. 922 on the proposed Walvis Bay-Livingstone route; thence in a south-easterly direction to beacon No. 910; thence to beacon No. 893 south of Thabatskudu; thence to a point 5 miles south of the Quadiba River mouth on the eastern side of the Makarikari; thence in a straight line to Foley Siding on the Mafeking-Bulawayo Railway.

(11) The area bounded on the north by a line commencing at the point of intersection of latitude 20 degrees south with the eastern boundary of the Batawana Reserve as defined in section two of Proclamation No. 9 of 1899; thence in an easterly direction along latitude 20 degrees south to its intersection with longitude 25 degrees east; thence along the southern boundary of area No. 10 through beacons Nos. 922, 910 and 893 to the point five miles south of the Quadiba River mouth; thence in a direction south-south-west through Sesalajwe Hill direct to the south-western boundary of the Bamangwato Reserve; thence north-west along this boundary to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the Ngamiland and Chobe District boundary, as defined by High Commissioner's Notice No. 79 of 1938; thence northwards along this boundary to the point of commencement.

(12) The remainder of the Bamangwato Reserve as defined by section *one* of Proclamation No. 9 of 1899.

(13) The Francistown District as defined in the first paragraph of section *three* of High Commissioner's Notice No. 119 of 1923.

(14) The land lying south of the Chobe River bounded on the west by the Batawana Reserve on the east by Southern Rhodesia, and on the south by the latitude 19 degrees south.

(15) The Batawana Reserve, as defined by section *two* of Proclamation No. 9 of 1899, together with the area of land lying to the east of the Batawana Reserve, having for its eastern boundary the longitude 25 degrees east and for its northern and southern boundaries the latitude 19 degrees and 20 degrees south respectively.

(16) The Ghanzi District as defined in section *ten* of High Commissioner's Notice No. 119 of 1923 and that part of the Kgalagadi District west of longitude 21 degrees east and north of latitude 24 degrees south.

(17) The Kgalagadi District as defined in section *eleven* of High Commissioner's Notice No. 119 of 1923 as amended by High Commissioner's Notice No. 17 of 1934, but excluding that part of the Kgalagadi District contained in the Ghanzi District described in area No. 16.
