**HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 176 of 1942.**

CONTROL OF NON-FERROUS MATERIALS.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to prohibit and order as follows:—

1. No person shall smelt any scrap or virgin non-ferrous metal or alloy into ingot or other shape for sale in any form where the said metal or alloy is to be again smelted in the process of manufacture into articles for use, unless such person is in possession of a licence issued by the Controller authorising the smelting of such metal or alloy.

2. No person shall sell any non-ferrous metal or alloy smelted into ingot or other shape under a licence issued in terms of section 1 hereof, unless such person furnishes a guarantee of its composition to the purchaser:

Provided that no such guarantee shall be required for such special alloys as may be authorised by the Controller to be sold without disclosure of their composition to the purchaser.

3. No person shall, except under the authority of and in accordance with a licence granted by the Controller, mark any crown cork or any part of a container made wholly or in part of tinfoil, or any tinfoil which is to be incorporated in any container with any mark or markings whatsoever, other than such a marking as can be marked thereon by passing the container or the tinfoil once through a marking machine:

Provided that nothing in this section shall prevent the use of protective varnish or lacquer in addition to such marking as is permitted

4. In these regulations "Controller" means the Government Secretary or such other officer as the Resident Commissioner may appoint.

5. Any person who contravenes any prohibition hereby imposed shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both such fine and imprisonment.
