HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 225 of 1942.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONTROL OF ENEMY
TRADING IN RESPECT OF LETTER AND
PARCEL MAIL.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section one of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section one of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 23 of 1939), and section one of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following regulations relating to the control of enemy trading in respect of letter and parcel mail in Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate and Swaziland, each of which is hereinafter respectively referred to as "the Territory":—

REGULATIONS.

1. For the purpose of these regulations "enemy territory" shall include enemy-occupied territory and any "restricted country" as defined in High Commissioner's Notice No. 50 of 1941, No. 51 of 1941 and No. 42 of 1941, or any amendment thereof.

2. Any goods in transit by letter or parcel mail through the Territory—

- (a) which were originally manufactured or produced in, or exported from, enemy territory; or
- (b) of which the ultimate destination appears *prima facie* to be enemy territory; or
- (c) which are directly or indirectly consigned to or destined for any person or firm whose name appears in the Schedule to High Commissioner's Notice No. 63 of 1941, and/or any existing or future amendments thereof,

shall be liable to seizure and, if seized, shall be disposed of by the Director of Customs as the Resident Commissioner may direct.

3. "Goods" shall include gold bullion; bank notes, coin and money of any other description; money- and postal-orders; bills of exchange; promissory notes and any other negotiable instrument; stamps whether for current use or of philatelic value; international reply coupons; lottery tickets; shares; stock; bonds; debentures; debenture stock; Treasury bills; units or sub-units of Unit trusts; coupons representing dividends or interest; documents or title of every description.

4. The provisions of regulation 2 shall not apply to goods which have been or may be dealt with in terms of High Commissioner's Notices No. 50 of 1941, No. 51 of 1941 or No. 52 of 1941, or any amendment thereof.
