HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 232 OF 1942.

CONTROL OF OIL.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following regulations relating to the rendering of returns of oil and grease in Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate and Swaziland.

REGULATIONS.

1. Every company, firm or person specified in regulation 2 owning or being in possession or control of any oil or grease of the types listed in the form attached hereto shall render a return of stocks of such oil or grease held at the date of publication of this Notice in the *Gazette* in the manner prescribed in the form attached hereto and not later than the dates respectively specified in the following regulation

2. The provisions of these regulations shall apply only to—

- (a) Government Departments, the South African Railways and Harbours Administration, all Public Utility undertakings, and all Mines including alluvial Mines, who shall render returns to the Government Secretary not later than the 30th September, 1942; and to
- (b) all factories and business concerns other than those mentioned in (a) above, all transport companies or firms, and all garages, who shall render returns to the Government Secretary not later than the 24th September, 1942.

Provided that where stocks of oil held amount to 45 gallons or less, and stocks of grease to 500 lb. or less, no return need be made

3. Stocks of grease must be expressed in pounds avoirdupois, and stocks of oil in imperial gallons. The contents of opened or in use containers must be estimated to the nearest pound or gallon.

4. No forms will be supplied.

5. Any person who fails to comply with any provision of these regulations or who knowingly furnishes any incorrect or incomplete information shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both such fine and imprisonment.
