**HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 245 of 1942.**

CONTROL OF NON-FERROUS METALS.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to prohibit and order as follows:-

1. No person shall, in any period of three months, use new tin metal in the manufacture of type metal (stereo metal, mono metal, lino metal) to an extent greater than fifty per cent. of one-quarter of the quantity of tin used by him for the same purpose in the calendar year 1941.

2. No person shall, in any period of three months, use any new tin metal or any of the metals constituting type metal in the process of replenishing or rejuvenating any used type metal to an extent greater than fifty per cent. of one-quarter of the new metal so used by him for the same purpose in the calendar year 1941.

3. No person shall use tin foil, aluminium foil or lead foil for the wrapping of cigarettes, tobacco, snuff, chocolates or sweets, save with the written consent of the Controller.

4. No person shall use tin or any tin alloy for fittings in automobile bodies or fenders.

5. No person shall manufacture solder containing more than 40 per cent. of tin, save with the written consent of the Controller.

6. No person shall use tin from sources outside South Africa in the manufacture of solders, type metals (stereo metal, mono metal, lino metal), anti-friction metals or other alloys, save with the written consent of the Controller.

7. No person shall use zinc in marine engines save as external protection plates.

8. In these regulations "Controller" means the Government Secretary or such other officer as the Resident Commissioner may appoint

9. Any person who contravenes any prohibition hereby imposed shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

10. These prohibitions shall come into force on the 1st October, 1942.
