HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE

REGULATIONS TO INTRODUCE SUMMER TIME IN BASUTOLAND, THE BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE AND SWAZILAND.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following regulations relating to the introduction of Summer Time in Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, and Swaziland:—

1. The time for general purposes in Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, and Swaziland shall, during the period of summer time, be one hour in advance of South African standard time.
2. Whenever any reference to a point of time occurs in any law or in any deed, notice or any other document whatsoever, the time referred to shall, during the period of summer time, be deemed to be the time fixed for general purposes by regulation 1 hereof.
3. Nothing in these regulations shall affect the use of South African standard time for purposes of astronomy or meteorology or affect the construction of any document mentioning or referring to a point of time in connection with these purposes.
4. For the purposes of these regulations, the period of summer time shall be taken to be the period commencing at two o'clock, South African standard time, on the morning of the first Sunday after the 15th day of the month of September in each year, and ending at two o'clock on the morning of the first Sunday after the 15th day of the month of March following.
