HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 275 OF 1942.

CONTROL OF PAPER.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to prohibit and order as follows:—

1. No person shall use cardboard for the manufacture of Christmas Cards.

2. (a) No paper of a caliper exceeding .009 in. or a size exceeding 40 square inches shall be used for the manufacture of Christmas Cards.

(b) Christmas Cards shall be printed in such a manner as to provide a space for the address, and folded in such a manner as to dispense with the use of envelopes.

3. No person shall supply, with any Christmas Card manufactured after the date of publication of this notice in the *Gazette*, envelopes for the posting of such Christmas Cards:

Provided, however, that envelopes may be supplied for the posting of Christmas Cards which were manufactured prior to the date of publication of this notice in the *Gazette*.

4. No printer shall print for an individual customer more than 5,000 Christmas Cards except by special authority of the Government Secretary.

5. Any person who contravenes any prohibition hereby imposed shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both such fine and imprisonment.
