

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

RESIDENT COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 2 of 1942.

It is hereby notified for general information that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section *six* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Native Schools Proclamation, 1938 (No. 26 of 1938), the Resident Commissioner has further amended the Rules for Native Schools published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 110 of 1938 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal rules") as follows:—

1. Rule 13 of the principal rules is hereby amended by deleting the words "having interest in schools" in the seventh and eighth lines thereof.

2. Rule 22 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following paragraph, the existing rule becoming paragraph (1):—

"(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these rules the Director of Education shall have power to terminate the appointment, employment or services of any teacher if he is satisfied that such teacher is incompetent or neglectful in the performance of his duties or has been guilty of misconduct or for any other reason whatsoever which the Director of Education may consider sufficient:

Provided that any teacher so discharged shall have the right to appeal to the Resident Commissioner within a period of twenty-one days from the date of his discharge:

Provided also that if such appeal be dismissed by the Resident Commissioner the discharged teacher shall not be entitled to any salary as from the date of his discharge."
