

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

RESIDENT COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 7 of 1942.

It is hereby notified for general information that, in terms of Regulation 39 (1) of the Regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 150 of 1939, I have ordered that no person other than a person licensed to deal in explosives in terms of Proclamation No. 50 of 1934, or a person to whom a permit has been issued for the importation of explosives in terms of Proclamation No. 9 of 1941, shall in any district of the Bechuanaland Protectorate be in possession of any explosives as defined in section *one* of the latter Proclamation without a permit from the District Commissioner of the district concerned, authorising the possession of such explosives by such person; provided that this prohibition shall not apply to persons bona fide employed at or about a mine in the Bechuanaland Protectorate in respect of such explosives as may be issued to them daily for use in their employment by the owner or manager of such mine, or to servants of the Government in respect of explosives, the property of the Government and issued to such persons for use in the execution of their duties.
