HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 11 of 1943.

ACQUISITION AND DISPOSAL OF MEALIES
AND MEALIE PRODUCTS.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to amend the regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 182 of 1942 by deleting the paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of regulation 1 and substituting therefor the following paragraphs:—

" (a) any person (not being a producer of mealies as defined hereunder) from disposing of mealies or mealie products, including mealies and mealie products contained in mixtures of any kind, except to a person who is in possession of a permit issued by the Controller of Mealies and Mealie Products authorising the purchase thereof, and subject to the conditions specified in such permit:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the disposal of mealies or mealie products, including mealies or mealie products contained in such mixtures, in quantities not exceeding in the aggregate 400 lb. of mealies and mealie products per month to any one person, subject to the conditions that—

- (i) the total quantity of mealie products (other than granulated mixed mealie meal or unsifted mixed mealie meal as defined in the regulations contained in the Annexure to High Commissioner's Notice No. 181 of 1942 as amended by High Commissioner's Notice No. 9 of 1943, but including such mealie meal contained in any such mixture) disposed of to any one person during any month shall not exceed 100 lb.;
- (ii) the total quantity of mealies disposed of during any month to any person other than a native shall not exceed 200 lb.;

- (b) any person from purchasing or otherwise acquiring mealies, mealie products or such mixtures otherwise than in accordance with the terms of proviso (i) or (ii) to paragraph (a), or under the authority of a permit as aforesaid;
- (c) any person from grinding, crushing, gristing or otherwise processing mealies, except under the authority of a permit issued by the said Controller, and in such quantities and on such conditions as may be specified in such permit:

Provided that no such permit shall be required by a bona fide farmer for grinding, crushing, gristing or otherwise processing mealies for consumption by his household or for the feeding of his own labourers or livestock."
