HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 129 of 1943.

IMPORTATION OF GOODS BY PARCEL POST
FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Exportation and Importation Proclamation, 1939 (No. 41 of 1939), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to order as follows:—

1. As from the 1st July, 1943, no person shall import by parcel post into the territory from the United Kingdom any goods except upon the authority of and subject to the conditions set forth in a special permit to import by parcel post issued by the Resident Commissioner in terms of sub-section (2) of section *one* of the said Proclamation:

Provided that no permit in terms of this Notice will be required for the importation by parcel post of any bona fide gifts not exceeding £2 in value and 11 lb. in weight; and provided further that this Notice shall not apply to goods accepted before the date of publication of this Notice in the *Gazette* by postal authorities for despatch to the Territory, or to parcels despatched to members of His Majesty's Forces addressed to a Post Office Number intended for troops serving in the Territory.

2. A permit to import issued under the provisions of High Commissioner's Notice No. 224 of 1941 shall not be valid as a special permit for the purposes of this Notice.

3. Upon receipt of a special permit to import by parcel post, the person to whom the parcel is to be addressed must advise the sender thereof, by telegraph or mail, of the number of the relative permit and the description given thereon of the goods covered.

4. High Commissioner's Notice No. 203 of 1942 is hereby revoked.
