HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 143 of 1943.

CONTROL OF PAPER.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following regulations relating to the control of paper in Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate and Swaziland.

1. Every company, firm or person holding stocks of paper aggregating 1,000 lbs. or more, or having stocks of paper on order, shall render a return in the form (Form P.C. 6) set out in the Annexure hereto of such stocks as disclosed by physical stocktaking, or as extracted from books. Such returns to be certified by auditors.

For the purpose of such returns "paper" shall mean all types of paper, including cardboard, paper-board, strawboard and the like; cellophane, rayophane, sidac, diaphane and all classes of cellulose film.

Returns are not required in respect of printed forms or stationery for own consumption, or in respect of printed books of all kinds.

For the purpose of the said returns, stocks, etc., of paper must be grouped in the following manner, and for Printers' Papers and Printers' Boards under Class I, cross totals by groups must be made:—

CLASS I.—PRINTERS' PAPERS AND PRINTERS'
BOARDS.

- Group 1.—Flat newsprint.
- Group 2.—M.F., S.C. and other printings white and/or tinted.
 - Art paper.
 - Imitation art white and/or tinted.
 - Litho varnish.
- Group 3.—M.G. poster.
 - Flints.
 - Chromo paper.
- Group 4.—Cartridge papers.
- Group 5.—Cream and/or tinted laid and wove.
- Group 6.—White and/or tinted bonds and banks, substance of 13 lb. and over per 500 sheets large post.
- Group 7.—White and/or tinted bonds and banks, substance of less than 13 lb. per 500 sheets large post.
 - White and/or tinted I.V.P.
- Group 8.—Ledger and account book paper.

- Group 9.—Gummed paper.
- Group 10.—Vegetable parchment.
- Group 11.—Cover papers.
Manillas.
- Group 12.—Printers' boards, white and/or tinted.
- Group 13.—Bookbinders' board.
- Group 14.—Sensitized paper for cheques, etc.
- Group 15.—Duplicating papers.
- Group 16.—Blotting papers.

CLASS II.—WRAPPING PAPERS, FLAT, FOLDED
OR IN ROLLS.

- Group 1.—Transparent cellulose of cellophane type.
- Group 2.—Waxed papers.
- Group 3.—Kraft (not elsewhere enumerated).
- Group 4.—Greaseproof and glassine.
- Group 5.—M.G. cap and sulphite tissue.

CLASS III.—INDUSTRIAL PAPERS AND BOARDS.

- Group 1.—Paper for bag making (kraft, etc., but excluding papers elsewhere enumerated).
- Group 2.—Paper for explosives.
- Group 3.—Kraft for cement bags.
- Group 4.—Paper for manufacture of corrugated containers.
- Group 5.—Paper for manufacture of toilet rolls.
- Group 6.—Gummed paper tape for sealing corrugated or solid containers.
- Group 7.—Box and carton boards.
- Group 8.—Board for manufacture of *solid containers*.
- Group 9.—Cigarette paper bobbins.
- Group 10.—Paper for manufacture of "Mono" type containers.
- Group 11.—Board for manufacture of "Mono" type containers.

CLASS IV.—PAPERS NOT ELSEWHERE ENUMERATED.
(SPECIFY.)

2. Returns on Form P.C. 6 must reach the Controller by noon on Saturday, the 31st day of July, 1943.

3. In these regulations "Controller" means the Government Secretary or such other officer as the Resident Commissioner may appoint.

4. Any person who fails to comply with any provision of these regulations or who knowingly furnishes any incorrect or incomplete information shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

NOTE.—Printed forms can be obtained from the Controller.
