TELEPHONE REGULATIONS.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by sub-section (4) of section *three* and section *four* of Act No. 10 of 1911 (the Post Office Administration and Shipping Combinations Discouragement Act, 1911) of the Union of South Africa, as of force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate, by virtue of Proclamation No. 28 of 1916 and of Proclamation No. 23 of 1928, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to approve, with effect from the 1st day of October, 1942, of the subjoined amendments to the Telephone Regulations of the Bechuanaland Protectorate published in Schedule B to the aforesaid Proclamation No. 23 of 1928.

AMENDMENTS TO TELEPHONE  
REGULATIONS.

*Regulation 13.*—In the first line delete “ If ” and insert “ Should ”. In the *fourth* line after “ right ” insert “ summarily to suspend outward or both-way service ”. Lines 4 and 5 delete “ to ” and “ summarily, disconnect his telephone ”.

*Regulation 14.*—Delete the heading “ RECONNECTION ” and substitute “ RESTORATION OF SERVICE ”. Line 1, after “ suspended ” insert “ in either of the ways provided for in the foregoing regulations ”, and delete “ in terms of the foregoing regulation ”. Line 3, delete “ 5s. ” and insert “ 2s. 6d. ”.
