

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.  
HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE  
No. 148 of 1944.

It is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to fix the following tariff of fees and charges for the use of Government property:—

1. *Ferry Service at Kazungula.*—A fee of 1s. shall be payable in respect of every head of cattle taken across the Zambesi River by the Government barge at Kazungula.

While every precaution will be taken, the Government accepts no liability for any loss, damage or injury to personnel or animals in the case of accident or otherwise howsoever.

2. *For the Use of Cattle Dipping Tanks.*—The following charges shall be payable:—

(a) 2d. per head with a minimum total charge of 5s. per dipping of numbers up to 100 head;

(b) 1½d. per head with minimum of 16s. 8d. per dipping of numbers from 100 to 200 head;

(c) 1d. per head with minimum of £1. 5s. per dipping of numbers over 200 head;

(d) 1d. per head on all cattle presented for export and rejected after dipping.

While every precaution will be taken in the provision of this service, the Government accepts no liability for any loss or injury to any animal which may be occasioned by dipping.

3. *For the Use of Weighbridges to Weigh Cattle not intended for Export.*—The charge under regulation 4 of the High Commissioner's Notice No. 11 of 1930 shall be 3d. per head.

4. *Grazing and Watering Fees in respect of Cattle.*

(a) Where grazing and watering are provided by Government, 6d. per head per month or part of a month shall be charged;

(b) where grazing only is provided, 2d. per head per month or part of a month shall be charged.

It is to be understood that grazing and water will only be hired when available.
