CONTROL OF CORRUGATED STEEL SHEETS
(CORRUGATED IRON).

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to cancel the regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 142 of 1942 and to make the following regulations relating to the control of corrugated steel sheets (corrugated iron) in Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate and Swaziland.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations—
“ Controller ” means the Government Secretary or such other officer as the Resident Commissioner may appoint;
“ corrugated sheets ” means any unused corrugated sheets made of iron or steel whether galvanised or ungalvanised and whether straight or curved.
2. As from the date of publication of this Notice in the *Gazette* no person shall acquire any corrugated sheets except upon the authority of and subject to the conditions set forth in a permit issued by the Controller.
3. Every application for a permit in terms of regulation 2 shall be made in the form set out in the Annexure to these regulations, shall contain the particulars for which provision is made in such Annexure, and shall comply with the requirements contained therein.
4. As from the date of publication of this Notice in the *Gazette* no person shall sell, supply or in any other way dispose of any corrugated sheets to any other person except upon delivery to him by such other person of a permit issued in terms of regulation 2. Such person so selling, supplying or disposing of corrugated sheets shall complete the endorsement at the foot of the permit and shall forward the permit to the Controller not later than thirty days after the

date of the supply of such sheets to the person to whom a permit was issued by the Controller.

5. Every person who sells, supplies or otherwise disposes of corrugated sheets in terms of regulation 4 shall in every instance keep a record of the number of the permit upon the authority of which such sheets have been disposed of, the numbers and the lengths of such sheets so disposed of and the name and the address of the person to whom such sheets were disposed of.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations the Controller may in his discretion grant exemption to any person from the whole or any part of the provisions of these regulations.
