HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 16 of 1944.

REGULATIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE
MANUFACTURE AND SALE OF CERTAIN
MEALIE PRODUCTS.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1936), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the regulations set forth in the Annexure hereto relating to the manufacture and sale of certain mealie products in Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate and Swaziland.

ANNEXURE.

1. In these regulations—

“fine granulated mealie meal” means granulated mealie meal from which not more than 10 per cent. by weight of the bran and other offals have been removed;

“sifted crushed mealies” means crushed mealies manufactured from whole mealies and from which not more than 10 per cent. by weight of offals have been removed;

“unsifted crushed mealies” means crushed mealies manufactured from whole mealies and from which no offals have been removed;

“unsifted mealie meal” means mealie meal from which no bran or other offals have been removed;

“sell” includes to offer, advertise, keep, expose, transmit, convey, deliver, or prepare for sale or exchange or to dispose of for any consideration whatsoever, and the words “seller”, “selling”, “sale” and “sold” have a corresponding meaning.

2. (1) No person shall—

(a) purchase or sell any mealie product of a class or kind defined in regulation 1 which does not conform to the requirements specified in that regulation in respect of that particular class or kind of mealie product;

(b) on behalf of any other person, or by means of a mill which is under the control of any other person, convert mealies or any mealie product into a mealie product of a class or kind defined in regulation 1, which does not conform to the requirements specified in that regulation in respect of that particular class or kind of mealie product.

(2) Any person who is, in pursuance of a contract entered into prior to the date of publication of these regulations in the *Gazette*, under an obligation to deliver to any other person any mealie product, shall be entitled to fulfil that obligation by delivering to that other person any mealie product which conforms to the requirements of regulation 3 of the regulations contained in the Annexure to High Commissioner's Notice No. 181 of 1942, and which he would have been obliged to deliver if sub-regulation (1) of this regulation had not been made.

3. Any person who contravenes any provision of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year.

4. High Commissioner's Notice No. 181 of 1942 is hereby cancelled.
