

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE

No. 184 of 1944.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Public Health (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation, 1924 (No. 12 of 1924), as amended, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to approve the following Regulation (made by the Resident Commissioner under that section) being substituted for regulation 8 of the Public Health Regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 116 of 1938:—

“ 8. A District Commissioner may, for the purpose of preventing the introduction or spread of smallpox or plague (bubonic, pneumonic or septicaemic) in his district, issue an order requiring all persons residing or being within such district or any specified area thereof to be effectively vaccinated or inoculated within a period to be prescribed by him, and it shall thereupon be the duty of every person residing or being within such district or area to cause himself and any minor children residing with him and under his control to be effectively vaccinated or inoculated within such period:

Provided that when a medical practitioner certifies in the case of any particular person that it is not desirable or not necessary that he should be vaccinated or inoculated, this regulation shall not apply so as to require him to be vaccinated or inoculated.”
