HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 74 of 1944.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *seven* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Public Service Proclamation, 1924 (No. 32 of 1924), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following additional regulations to the regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 145 of 1925, as amended:—

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

CHAPTER VIII.

COMPENSATION TO OFFICERS FOR DAMAGE TO
FURNITURE ON TRANSFER.

1. Subject to the approval of the High Commissioner, officers transferred from one station to another on duty may be refunded the cost of repairing or replacing furniture damaged or broken in the course of removal.

2. (1) All claims in this connection must be accompanied by a statement to the effect---

(a) that the officer concerned has not been guilty of negligence or carelessness in connection with the consignment and the delivery or acceptance of the goods;

(b) that the packers or carriers cannot be held liable for damage or loss;

(c) that the value claimed in respect of loss has been assessed by some impartial person, whose original assessment should be attached to the claim.

(2) In the case of damage, the amount claimed for repairs should be supported by vouchers.

(3) A full statement showing probable cause of loss or damage should be furnished with the claim.
