It is hereby notified for general information that, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon me under regulation 39A (1) (a) of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Defence Regulations, 1939, I do hereby fix throughout the Bechuanaland Protectorate the prices specified in the Schedule hereto as the maximum prices at which kaffir corn may be sold by licensed dealers to persons who are not licensed dealers.

This order shall come into force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

MAXIMUM PRICES OF KAFFIR CORN.—

- (a) *Imported into the Territory*— *none* *3/6 per bag*

| (i) At all centres on the railway line... | 28s. per bag.                                      |
| (ii) At outlying centres.....             | 28s. per bag plus cost of transport from railhead. |
- (b) *Locally grown Kaffir Corn purchased under Permit of Native Authority*..... The selling price to traders will be that approved by the Native Authority in the area concerned and notified through the District Commissioner. To this price may be added handling charges of 2s. per bag, 2s. 6d. per bag profit and where such corn is removed from the centre at which it is purchased cost of transport to place of sale may be added.
