HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 206 of 1945.

FURTHER RELAXATION OF CONTROL OF
MOTOR VEHICLES.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following regulation relating to the control of motor vehicles in Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate and Swaziland:—

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 99 of 1945, as amended by High Commissioner's Notice No. 165 of 1945, no permit shall be necessary or required for the acquisition by any person of—

- (a) any new or used commercial vehicle, including bus, truck, lorry, tractor trailer unit, van, express delivery, light delivery, pick-up, station wagon, and any motor vehicle commonly described as a commercial vehicle, but excluding any passenger motor car designed to carry not more than seven passengers, other than the passenger/motor cars described in paragraph (b) hereof;
- (b) any used passenger motor car acquired from a dealer who has purchased such used passenger motor car from the War Stores Disposals Board of the Union of South Africa for the purpose of re-sale to the public.

Such cars shall bear the following distinctive marks stamped on the right-hand front doorpost:—

- (1) The original U number.
- (2) The Union Government (Defence) ownership mark.
- (3) The Union Government (Defence) sale mark.
