HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE

No. 67 of 1945.

CONTROL OF PETROL.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 35 of 1939), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 36 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Emergency Powers (Defence) Proclamation, 1939 (No. 37 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to amend the regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 204 of 1943, as amended by High Commissioner's Notices Nos. 268 of 1943 and 126 of 1944 as follows:—

1. Regulation 5 (1) is amended by the deletion of the words "in sets or folders".

2. Regulation 9 (1) is repealed and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

"9. (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-regulation (4) of regulation 5, no reseller of petrol shall supply petrol to any person and no person shall acquire petrol from a reseller unless—

(a) the person to be supplied has delivered to the prospective supplier petrol ration coupons representing the quantity of petrol to be supplied;

(b) the supplier or his servant has before supplying such petrol satisfied himself that every such coupon bears in print the name of the month in which the petrol is so supplied and that each coupon also bears the registration letters and numbers appearing on the licence registration plates affixed to the motor vehicle for which petrol is required;

(c) the petrol so supplied is poured directly into the tank, which is a normal part of the motor vehicle described in (b); or

(d) the person to be supplied has delivered to the prospective supplier a special petrol permit issued in terms of regulation 7 and the petrol is supplied in accordance with that permit."

3. Regulation 10 is amended by the deletion of paragraphs (a) and (b) and the substitution therefor of the following new paragraphs:—

"(a) fail to impress, by means of a rubber stamp in clearly legible letters on the front of each petrol

ration coupon, petrol permit and special petrol permit, against which he or his agent has supplied petrol, the complete name or the trade name under which he conducts the business of reseller of petrol;

(b) fail to comply with the requirements of sub-regulation (a) of this regulation within twenty-four hours after the said supply of petrol has been made."
