

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 9 OF 1946.

It is hereby notified for general information that, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon him under Regulation 39 A (i) of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Defence Regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 150 of 1939, as amended by High Commissioner's Notice No. 50 of 1942, the Resident Commissioner hereby orders that:

1. Government Notice No. 6 of 1945, dated 11th April, 1945, is hereby cancelled, and the following items in the Schedule to Government Notice No. 25 of 1945, dated 7th December, 1945, are deleted:—
 2. Maize and Maize Products.
 3. Kaffir corn and kaffir corn products.
 4. Meal.
 5. Flour.

2. The maximum prices at which maize and maize products, kaffir corn and kaffir corn products, boer meal and flour may be sold in the Bechuanaland Protectorate by licensed dealers to persons who are not licensed dealers shall be fixed in the manner specified in the Schedule hereto:

Provided that a profit of 3s. per 200 lb. may be added to the cost of maize and maize products, and kaffir corn and kaffir corn products and a profit of 6s. per 200 lb. may be added to the cost of boer meal and flour.

3. The provisions of Regulations 2 and 3 of Government Notice No. 25 of 1945 shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to the commodities governed by this Notice.

SCHEDULE.

Maximum prices of kaffir corn, kaffir corn products, maize and maize products, boer meal and flour:—

(a) Imported into the Bechuanaland Protectorate—

- (i) At centres on the rail- Landed cost, plus handling charges
way line of 2s. per 200 lb.
- (ii) At outlying centres... Landed cost, plus handling charges
of 2s. per 200 lb., plus the cost
of transport from railhead at
rates approved by government.

(b) Locally grown in the Bechuanaland Protectorate—

Purchased under permit of Native Authority

The selling price to traders will be that approved by the Native Authority in the area concerned and notified through the District Commissioner. To this price may be added handling charges of 2s. per 200 lb., and where such products are removed from the centre at which they are purchased, the cost of transport at rates approved by the government to the place of sale, may be added.
