HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 13 of 1946.

RELAXATION OF EXPORT CONTROL.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Exportation and Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1941 (No. 4 of 1941), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Exportation and Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1939 (No. 41 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Exportation and Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1939 (No. 46 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to order as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in High Commissioner's Notices Nos. 249, 250 and 251 of 1942 (as amended from time to time), on and after the date of publication of this notice in the *Gazette* no export permit shall be necessary or required for the exportation from Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate or Swaziland of any goods other than those shown in the Schedule to this notice.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 1, no permit shall be necessary or required for the exportation of—

(a) used personal or household effects the property of persons leaving Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate or Swaziland permanently; and

(b) articles of food (except sugar, tea and condensed milk) to a total net weight of 25 lb. for each person, provided such foodstuffs accompany persons permanently leaving Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate or Swaziland and are their own property.

SCHEDULE.

AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS, MACHINERY AND
REQUISITES.

- (1) Jute or hessian in the piece or made up, including containers made of jute or hessian materials.

- (2) Spare parts and accessories for agricultural machinery.
- (3) Tractors, all types, and spare parts and accessories therefor.

AGRICULTURE.

- (1) Animal protein (fishmeal and meatmeal).
 - (2) Barley, oats and rye and their products, namely: barley meal, barley malt, pearl barley, crushed oats, oatmeal, oatflakes, rye flour and rye meal.
 - (3) Bonemeal for feeding livestock.
 - (4) Butter and cheese.
 - (5) Cigarettes.
 - (6) Feedstuffs, protein rich (oilcakes and meal).
 - (7) Feedstuffs for stock, poultry and pets.
 - (8) Fertilizers.
 - (9) Horns and hoofs.
 - (10) Livestock, namely: cattle, horses, mules and donkeys.
 - (11) Fodders, namely: lucerne, oats and teff.
 - (12) Meat.
 - (13) Potatoes, seed.
 - (14) Seed protectants and inoculants.
 - (15) Seeds, vegetable and grass.
 - (16) Sweet potatoes.
 - (17) Thatch grass.
 - (18) Tobacco, manufactured cut and leaf tobacco.
- (NOTE.—For mohair see under Textiles.)

CONTROLLER OF BUILDING MATERIALS.

- (1) Brassware, plumbers'.
- (2) Builders' hardware.
- (3) Brushes, painters'.
- (4) Ceiling board and wallboard, including hardboard.
- (5) Electrical appliances, equipment and materials, all.
- (6) Floor coverings, asphaltic.
- (7) Gauze, mosquito.
- (8) Glass, sheet, plate, wired and obscured.
- (9) Linseed oil.
- (10) Refrigeration and air conditioning equipment, *including* refrigerators.
- (11) Roofing felt and dampcourse.
- (12) Stoves, ranges, boilers, geysers, cylinders and fires of all types, *including* electric, and parts therefor.
- (13) Sanitaryware of earthenware and stoneware, *excluding* earthenware pipes.
- (14) Sanitaryware, metal, *including* such articles as baths, basins, sinks, cisterns and pipes.
- (15) Tiles, wall and floor.

COMMODITY PANELS.

- (1) Firearms and ammunition of all kinds.
- (2) Gold, gold plated or rolled gold jewellery, *except* gem rings the gold values of which are insignificant.

- (3) Razors and razor blades.
- (4) Sporting and athletic goods, all.
- (5) Watches and clocks and parts therefor.

Food.

All articles of food or drink, including such as are used as ingredients or materials in the manufacture, processing and preserving of food.

NOTE.—Flavouring essences and colouring materials are not included. For oils and fats see under Soap and Oils and for animal feedstuffs under Agriculture.

INDUSTRIAL CHEMICALS.

Chemicals, namely: accelerators and anti-oxidants used in the rubber industry; ammonium nitrate, phosphate and sulphate; argols; arsenious oxide; bone ash; calcium phosphate; Carbon black; cattle dips containing nicotine sulphate; citric acid; copal gum; derris powder and root; fertilizers; insecticides containing nicotine sulphate; nicotine sulphate; pentachlorophenol; phosphate rock; pine oil; potassium chloride and hydroxide; resins (synthetic); rosin; rotenone; sodium nitrate; tartaric acid; tetrachlorethylene; tin oxide; titanium dioxide; trichlorethylene; wine lees; zinc oxide.

Laboratory and Scientific Apparatus and Requisites Section: Autoclaves; balances; balance weights; colorimeters; haemacytometers; haemometers; haemoglobinometers; lovibond comparators; lovibond comparator discs; microscopes; pH meters; thermometers, industrial and laboratory—all types.

IRON AND STEEL.

- (1) Iron and steel, worked or unworked, in any of the following forms:—
 - (a) Angle, channel, joist, tee, piling section and other structural sectional material;
 - (b) billet, bloom, ingot, sheet bar and slab;
 - (c) plate and sheet (coated or uncoated);
 - (d) round, rod, square, hexagon, flat and other section or shape (black or bright);
 - (e) hoop and strip (coated or uncoated);
 - (f) bolts, nuts, rivets, studs, screws, nails, staples and washers;
 - (g) fencing standards and droppers;
 - (h) rails and sleepers and fastenings therefor;
 - (i) shaft guides, pit props and other underground supports and accessories therefor;
 - (j) tubes, pipes and other tubular products (coated or uncoated) and standard fittings therefor;
 - (k) wire rods (coated or uncoated), wire (plain or barbed), wire strand, wire netting, wire mesh and wire screen.
- (2) Tinplate and terneplate and empty containers consisting wholly or partly of tinplate or terneplate.

LEATHER.

- (1) Footwear.
- (2) Hides and skins, *excluding* merino sheepskins and Angora goatskins and karakul, lion, tiger and reptile skins.
- (3) Leather, all types.
- (4) Machinery and repair or spare parts, leather industry.

MACHINE TOOLS.

- (1) Machine tools, that is to say, any mechanical device for cutting, forming, abrading, polishing or otherwise working metal or wood. Augers and mortice chisels for wood working and inserted tooth type circular saws and spare teeth and holders therefor but *excluding* any other equipment or attachment used with machine tools.
- (2) Hand tools, *except*: Anvils; bars; *wrecking* and other; blades, hacksaw; blocks, bench; blocks and clamps, toolmakers'; bobbins, plumbers'; brushes, steel including boiler tube brushes; calipers, pocket slide; chisels, metal-working; cleavers and meat choppers; dressers for abrasive wheels, other than diamond type; expanders, boiler tube; extractors, gland packing; files; hatchets; knives, butchers'; picks; plates, surface; portable electric and pneumatic tools (hand held); pots, glue and melting; rasps; shovels; soldering irons, not electric; spades; steels, knife sharpening; stops, bench.

PAPER.

All types of paper, including cardboard, paperboard, strawboard and the like, both in the raw and in the manufactured or made-up form; cellophane, rayophane, sidac, diaphane and all classes of cellulose film; pliofilm.

MEDICAL AND PHOTOGRAPHIC REQUISITES.

- (1) Drugs and medicines, namely (a) agar agar; (b) atropine and its salts; (c) cinchona and its preparations; (d) cinchonidine and cinchonine and their salts and preparations; (e) quinine and quinidine and their salts and preparations; (f) codeine preparations and preparations of codeine salts; (g) emetine and its salts and preparations; (h) ephedrine and its salts; (i) insulin, plain, protamine zinc and globin; (j) ipecacuanha; (k) morphine acetate, hydrochloride and sulphate; (l) morphine tartrate and alkaloid; (m) ethylmorphine hydrochloride and diacetylmorphine hydrochloride; (n) opium; (o) papaverine and its salts; (p) penicillin; (q) pethidine; (r) sulphadiazine, sulphaguanidine and sulphamethazine and their preparations; (s) totaquine.

- (2) Saccharine and solutions thereof.
- (3) Adhesive plasters.
- (4) Batteries for hearing aids.
- (5) Beds, air and water.
- (6) Dental burs; dental chairs; dental operating units.
- (7) Films, photographic, including cinematograph:—
 - (a) unexposed 8 mm., 16 mm. and 35 mm.;
 - (b) cut sheet, including commercial and portrait;
 - (c) X-ray, dental and medical.
- (8) Haemocytometers and parts therefor.
- (9) Optical goods; (a) lenses, semifinished or otherwise, all types; (b) spectacle cases; (c) spectacle frames, all; (d) spectacle mountings.
- (10) Pessaries, except medicated pessaries.
- (11) Photograph bromide and contact paper, sensitised.
- (12) Pillows, air.
- (13) Prophylactics, rubber.
- (14) Teats, all types.
- (15) Thermometers, bath, clinical and sick-room.
- (16) Surgical gauze.

MOTOR VEHICLES.

- (1) Batteries, electrical, secondary and component parts therefor.
- (2) Bicycles, pedal and parts and accessories therefor.
- (3) Motor cycles and parts and accessories therefor.
- (4) Motor vehicles and parts and accessories therefor but excluding motor cars the personal property of persons leaving Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate or Swaziland for periods not exceeding six months, provided the car is returned to Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate or Swaziland.

NON-FERROUS MATERIALS.

- (1) Lead, in ingots, pipes or piping and sheets.
- (2) Solder and white metal, in any form.
- (3) Tin in bars, rods and ingots and tin concentrates.

RUBBER.

- (1) Alkaline reclaim.
- (2) Camelback.
- (3) Rubber, other: crude, latex and synthetic of all kinds.
- (4) Tyres and tubes for motor cars, motor cycles, cycles or other wheeled vehicles.

SOAP AND OILS.

- (1) Candles.
- (2) Drums, empty, lubricating oil.
- (3) Fats, animal and vegetable.
- (4) Fatty acids.
- (5) Fish oil.
- (6) Fish liver (vitamin) oils.

- (7) Glycerine and glycol.
- (8) Oil seeds.
- (9) Oils, animal and vegetable.
- (10) Petroleum products and derivatives, namely: lubricating oils and greases; paraffin wax, petroleum jelly.
- (11) Polishes.
- (12) Soap and substances containing soap.
- (13) Tanning oils.
- (14) Vitaminised oils.
- (15) Whale and sperm oil.

TEXTILES.

- (1) All types of fibres, bristles, yarns, threads and woven and knitted piece goods and articles manufactured therefrom, *including* bedding, clothing, hosiery, headwear, brushware, furnishings and other household articles, ropes and twines and all other textiles but *excluding* unprocessed mohair.
- (2) Haberdashery, all types.
- (3) Sewing machines, domestic and industrial and spare parts and accessories therefor.
- (4) All machinery and spare parts and accessories for the textile and allied industries.

TIMBER.

- (1) Joinery:—
 - (a) Doors and windows and door frames, wooden;
 - (b) wooden frameworks of houses, *including* sills, sashes, lintels, staircases, casements, wooden shutters and mouldings.
- (2) Wood:—
 - (a) Unmanufactured softwood (coniferous);
 - (b) ceiling and flooring boards, planed, tongued and grooved; and parquet flooring.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Diamonds, cut or polished, when exported to the United Kingdom.

NOTES.

1. The effect of this notice is to remove the war-time restriction on the exportation of all goods other than those shown in the Schedule. Attention is drawn to existing exemptions provided in High Commissioner's Notices Nos. 249, 250 and 251 of 1942, as amended.

2. It should be noted that it is required by the Customs Department that exporters claiming the export of permit-free goods must make and subscribe to the following certificate on the Customs Bill of Entry, Export: "I certify that the goods marked X are not subject to export permit.
