HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 159 of 1946.

FURTHER RELAXATION OF EXPORT
CONTROL.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Exportation and Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1941 (No. 4 of 1941), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Exportation and Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1939 (No. 41 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Exportation and Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1939 (No. 46 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to amend High Commissioner's Notice No. 25 of 1946 by deleting the Schedule thereto and substituting therefor the Schedule to this notice.

SCHEDULE.

AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS, MACHINERY
AND REQUISITES.

Jute or hessian in the piece or made up, including containers made of jute or hessian materials.

AGRICULTURE.

- (1) Animal protein (fishmeal and meatmeal).
- (2) Barley, oats and rye and their products, namely, barley meal, barley malt, pearl barley, crushed oats, oatmeal, oatflakes, rye flour and rye meal.
- (3) Bonemeal for feeding livestock.
- (4) Feedstuffs, protein rich (oilcakes and meal).
- (5) Feedstuffs for stock, poultry and pets.
- (6) Fertilizers.
- (7) Horns and hoofs.
- (8) Livestock, namely, cattle, horses, mules and donkeys.
- (9) Fodder, namely, lucerne, oats and teff.
- (10) Potatoes, seed.

- (11) Seed protectants and inoculants.
 - (12) Seeds, grass.
 - (13) Sweet potatoes, seed.
 - (14) Thatch grass.
 - (15) Wool, raw and scoured.
- (NOTE.—For mohair see under Textiles.)

BUILDING MATERIALS.

- (1) Brassware, plumbers'.
 - (2) Builders' hardware.
 - (3) Brushes, painters'.
 - (4) Ceiling board and wallboard, including hard-board.
 - (5) Electrical appliances, equipment and materials, all.
 - (6) Gauze, mosquito.
 - (7) Glass, sheet, plate, wired and obscured.
 - (8) Refrigeration and air conditioning equipment, *including* refrigerators.
 - (9) Stoves, ranges, boilers, geysers, cylinders and fires of all types, *including* electric, and parts thereof.
 - (10) Sanitaryware of earthenware and stoneware, *excluding* earthenware pipes.
 - (11) Sanitaryware, metal, *including* such articles as baths, basins, sinks, cisterns and pipes.
- (NOTE.—For linseed oil see Soap and Oils.)

COMMODITY PANELS.

See Explanatory Note (2).

FOOD.

All articles of food or drink including such as are used as ingredients or materials in the manufacture, processing and preserving of food.

NOTE.—Flavouring essences and colouring materials are not included. For oils and fats see under Soap and Oils, and for animal feedstuffs see under Agriculture.

CONTROLLER OF INDUSTRIAL CHEMICALS.

- (1) Ammonium nitrate, phosphate and sulphate.
- (2) Wine lees.
- (3) Argols.
- (4) Bone ash.
- (5) Calcium phosphate.
- (6) Cattle dips containing nicotine sulphate.
- (7) Citric acid.
- (8) Derris powder and root.
- (9) Insecticides containing nicotine sulphate.
- (10) Nicotine sulphate.
- (11) Pentachlorophenol.

- (12) Phosphate rock.
- (13) Pine oil.
- (14) Potassium chloride and hydroxide.
- (15) Rosin.
- (16) Rotenone.
- (17) Sodium nitrate.
- (18) Tetrachlorethylene.

IRON AND STEEL.

- (1) Iron and steel, worked or unworked, in any of the following forms:—
 - (a) Angle, channel, joist, tee, piling section and other structural sectional material.
 - (b) Billet, bloom, ingot, sheet, bar and slab.
 - (c) Plate (coated or uncoated).
 - (d) Sheet (coated or uncoated) and all articles made therefrom.
 - (e) Round, rod, square, hexagon, flat and other section or shape (black or bright).
 - (f) Chain.
 - (g) Hoop and strip (coated or uncoated).
 - (h) Bolts, nuts, rivets, studs, screws, nails, staples and washers.
 - (i) Fencing standards and droppers.
 - (j) Rails, steel sleepers and accessories.
 - (k) Shafts guides, pit props and other underground supports and accessories therefor.
 - (l) Tubes, pipes and other tubular products (coated or uncoated) including products where tubes are only partly used, and standard fittings therefor.
 - (m) Wire rods (coated or uncoated), wire rope, wire (plain or barbed), and all articles made therefrom.
- (2) Tinplate and terneplate and empty containers consisting wholly or partly of tinplate or terneplate.

LEATHER.

- (1) Hides and skins, *excluding* merino sheepskins and angora goatskins and karakul, ostrich and all wild animal and reptile skins.
- (2) Hide and skin pieces, whether unprocessed, processed or partly processed.
- (3) Leather, all types.

MACHINE TOOLS.

- (a) Machine tools (including welding machines), that is to say, any mechanical device for cutting, forming abrading, polishing or otherwise working metal or wood.
- (b) Augers and mortice chisels for woodworking, inserted tooth type circular saws and spare teeth and

holders therefor, *but excluding any other equipment or attachment used with machine tools or welding machines.*

(c) Hand tools.

- (1) Adzes.
- (2) Augers, woodboring.
- (3) Awls and bradawls.
- (4) Bellows, hand (not for household use).
- (5) Bits, carpenters', all types.
- (6) Braces, bit (carpenters'), and spares.
- (7) Chisels and gouges (woodworking).
- (8) Clamps and cramps, carpenters' (bar, sash and G).
- (9) Compasses, carpenters'.
- (10) Cutters, glass and spares (excluding diamond glass cutters).
- (11) Draw knives.
- (12) Dressers, turnpins and bending sticks, plumbers'.
- (13) Drills, breast and hand.
- (14) Frames, hacksaw.
- (15) Gauges, carpenters'.
- (16) Gimlets.
- (17) Grinders, bench, hand.
- (18) Hammers, all types.
- (19) Knives, putty.
- (20) Lamps, blow (petrol and paraffin), and spares.
- (21) Levels and spare tubes.
- (22) Mallets, wooden—all types.
- (23) Nippers, wire cutting.
- (24) Pincers.
- (25) Planes, carpenters' (all types), and spares.
- (26) Pliers, all types.
- (27) Rods, drain cleaning, and accessories.
- (28) Rules, boxwood.
- (29) Saws, hand (all types), and spares.
- (30) Screwdrivers, all types.
- (31) Sets and squares, combination, and spares.
- (32) Sets, saw.
- (33) Snips and shears, metal cutting and tailors'.
- (34) Spokeshaves.
- (35) Squares and bevels.
- (36) Straightedges.
- (37) Strainers, wire, fencing, and other types.
- (38) Tapes, measuring, all types.
- (39) Tools, fender and panel beating.
- (40) Tools for footwear industry.
- (41) Tools, special, for motor industry, viz., battery testers, cylinder ridge removers, piston ring compressors and expander, piston pin inserting tools, gear and wheel pullers.

- (42) Tools, tube flaring.
- (43) Tools, valve.
- (44) Trowels, artisans', including plasterers' tools.
- (45) Vices, all types and spares.
- (46) Wrenches, all types and spares.

NOTE.—Export permits are not required for any of the hand tools scheduled above which form part of the tools of trade of artisans or mechanics leaving Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate or Swaziland to take up employment elsewhere.

CONTROLLER OF MEDICAL AND PHOTO- GRAPHIC REQUISITES.

- (1) Drugs and medicines, namely:—
 - (a) Quinine and quinidine and their salt and preparations.
 - (b) Codeine preparations and preparations of codeine salt.
 - (c) Emetine and its salts and preparations.
 - (d) Ethylmorphine hydrochloride and diacetylmorphine hydrochloride.
 - (e) Insulin, plain, protamine zinc and globin.
 - (f) Ipecacuanha.
 - (g) Opium.
 - (h) Papaverine and its salts.
 - (i) Penicillin.
 - (j) Pathidine.
- (2) Saccharine and solutions thereof.
- (3) Batteries for hearing aids.
- (4) Beds, air and water.
- (5) Hæmocrytometers and parts therefor.
- (6) Pessaries, *except* medicated pessaries.
- (7) Pillows, air.
- (8) Teats, all types.
- (9) Thermometers, bath, clinical and sick-room.
- (10) Surgical gauze.

CONTROLLER OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

- (1) Batteries, electrical, secondary and component parts therefor.
- (2) Bicycles, pedal and parts and accessories therefor.
- (3) Motor cycles and parts and accessories therefor.
- (4) Motor vehicles and parts and accessories therefor but excluding motor cars the personal property of persons leaving Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate or Swaziland for periods not exceeding six months, provided the car is returned to Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate or Swaziland, as the case may be.

NON-FERROUS MATERIALS.

- (1) Lead, in ingots, pipes or piping and sheets.
- (2) Solder and white metal in any form.
- (3) Tin in bars, rods and ingots and tin concentrates.

RUBBER.

- (1) Alkaline reclaim.
- (2) Camelback.
- (3) Rubber, other: crude, latex and synthetic of all kinds.
- (4) Tyres and tubes for motor cars, motor cycles, cycles or other wheeled vehicles.

PAPER.

Typewriters.

SOAP AND OILS.

- (1) Candles.
- (2) Drums, empty, lubricating oil.
- (3) Fats, animal and vegetables.
- (4) Fatty acids.
- (5) Fish oil.
- (6) Fish liver (vitamin) oils.
- (7) Glycerine and glycol.
- (8) Oil seeds.
- (9) Oils, animal and vegetable, including linseed oil.
- (10) Paraffin wax.
- (11) Polishes.
- (12) Soap and substances containing soap.
- (13) Tanning oils.
- (14) Vitamised oils.
- (15) Whale and sperm oil.

TEXTILES.

- (1) All types of fibres, bristles, yarns, threads and woven and knitted piece-goods and articles manufactured therefrom, *including* bedding and mattresses, clothing, hosiery, furnishings and other household articles, ropes and twines and all other textiles but *excluding* unprocessed mohair, haberdashery other than threads, brushware and headware.
- (2) Sewing machines, domestic and industrial.

Provided that no permit shall be required for the export of any of the above-mentioned textiles and machines to Northern and Southern Rhodesia.

TIMBER.

- (1) Joinery:—
 - (a) Doors and windows and door frames, wooden.
 - (b) Wooden frameworks of houses, *including* sills, sashes, lintels, staircases, casements, wooden shutters and mouldings.

(2) Wood:—

- (a) Unmanufactured softwood (coniferous).
- (b) Ceiling and flooring boards, planed, tongued and grooved; and parquet flooring.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Diamonds, cut or polished, when exported to the United Kingdom.

EXPLANATORY NOTES.—

(1) The effect of this Notice is—

(a) that a number of articles are removed from the previous list of articles requiring an export permit;

(b) that typewriters have been added to the previous list of articles requiring an export permit.

Goods not shown in the above Schedule may be exported without permit.

(2) Although gold has been deleted from the previous list, the export of gold in any form, including jewellery, is still prohibited by the Defence (Finance) Regulations (High Commissioner's Notices Nos. 234, 235 and 236 of 1939) except under a permit granted by an authorised dealer in exchange, and persons wishing to export gold should now apply to their bankers.

(3) It should be noted that it is required by the Customs Department that exporters claiming the export of permit-free goods must make and subscribe to the following certificate on the Customs Bill of Entry, Export: "I certify that the goods marked X are not subject to export permit.
