

SWAZILAND.

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 123 OF 1947.

It is hereby notified for general information that in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Swaziland Dairies and Dairy Produce Regulations, published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 186 of 1941, the Resident Commissioner, with the approval of the High Commissioner, has—

(a) in terms of regulation 59 (1) of the said regulations imposed the levies mentioned in Schedule A hereto; and

(b) in terms of regulations 78, 82 and 83 of the said regulations imposed the prohibitions mentioned in Schedule B hereto.

2. The aforesaid levies and the prohibitions mentioned in Schedules A and B shall be deemed to have been operative as from the 21st day of May, 1947.

3. High Commissioner's Notice No. 58 of 1946 and No. 50 of 1947 are hereby cancelled.

SCHEDULE A.

There is imposed on all—

(a) creamery butter a levy of one twenty-fifth of a penny per pound;

(b) farm dairy butter a levy of one penny per pound.

SCHEDULE B.

1. No producer of factory cream shall sell any such cream and no butter manufacturer shall purchase any such cream—

(a) otherwise than on the basis of the butter-fat contained therein; or

(b) at a price other than two shillings and two-pence per pound for first grade butter-fat, two shillings per pound for second grade butter-fat and one shilling and tenpence per pound for third grade butter-fat.

2. (1) No butter manufacturer shall sell salted creamery butter at a price other than—

(a) two shillings and fourpence per pound for first grade butter;

(b) two shillings and twopence per pound for second grade butter;

(c) two shillings per pound for third grade butter.

(2) No butter manufacturer shall sell unsalted creamery butter at a price other than—

(a) two shillings and fourpence one farthing per pound for first grade butter;

(b) two shillings and twopence one farthing per pound for second grade butter;

(c) two shillings one farthing per pound for third grade butter.

3. (1) No person shall sell salted or unsalted creamery butter at a price exceeding—

(a) two shillings and sixpence per pound for first grade butter;

(b) two shillings and fourpence per pound for second grade butter;

(c) two shillings and twopence per pound for third grade butter.

(2) The prohibition imposed under sub-clause (1) of this clause shall not apply in respect of the sale of butter by a butter manufacturer.
