ADDITIONAL PUBLIC HEALTH  
REGULATIONS.

---

1. For the purpose of these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Inspecting Officer” means and includes a Medical Officer, Sanitary Inspector, Health Inspector, Veterinary Officer and any Stock Inspector appointed by the Resident Commissioner for the purpose of these regulations;

“Medical Officer” means a Government Medical Officer or such other registered medical practitioner as may be appointed by the Resident Commissioner as Medical Officer for any district or sub-district;

“Veterinary Officer” means the officer for the time being holding the appointment of Principal Veterinary Officer or Assistant Veterinary Officer to the Swaziland Administration or any person appointed to act in such capacity.

2. No person shall store or expose for sale or allow to be stored or exposed for sale any fresh, salted, frozen, preserved or cooked meats or any polony, ham, bacon, eggs, butter, poultry, fish, fruit or fresh vegetables in a room which is used as a living room or bedroom or which in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer or District Officer is not suitably constructed or is not kept to his satisfaction.

3. It shall be an offence under these regulations for any person to sell or offer for sale any fresh, salted, frozen, preserved or cooked meats or any polony, ham, bacon, eggs, butter, poultry, fish, fruit or fresh vegetables which is unfit for human consumption. It shall be lawful for the Inspecting Officer to return or seize any such article which is in his opinion unfit for human consumption and order the same to be destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent it from being exposed for sale or used for the food of man.

4. Every person who handles butchers' meat or meat products shall keep his hands and person clean and wear clean overalls or aprons.

5. It shall be an offence under these regulations for any person suffering from a contagious disease to handle any fresh, salted, frozen, preserved or cooked meats or any polony, ham, bacon, eggs, butter, poultry, fish, fruit or fresh vegetables sold or offered for sale, and it shall also be an offence for any other person to employ any such person on duties which necessitate the handling of such articles by such person.
