

SWAZILAND.

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 171 OF 1947.

1. It is hereby notified for general information that, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Swaziland Dairies and Dairy Produce Regulations, published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 186 of 1941, the Resident Commissioner, with the approval of the High Commissioner—

(a) in terms of regulation 59 (1) of the said regulations, imposed the levies mentioned in Schedule A hereto; and

(b) in terms of regulations 78, 82 and 83 of the said regulations, imposed the prohibitions mentioned in Schedule B hereto.

2. The aforesaid levies and prohibitions mentioned in Schedules A and B shall be deemed to have been operative as from the 1st day of June, 1947.

3. High Commissioner's Notice No. 153 of 1947 is hereby cancelled.

SCHEDULE A.

There is imposed on all—

(a) creamery butter a levy of one twenty-fifth of a penny per pound;

(b) farm dairy butter a levy of three-fourths of a penny per pound.

SCHEDULE B.

1. No producer of factory cream shall sell any such cream and no butter manufacturer shall purchase any such cream—

(a) otherwise than on the basis of the butterfat contained therein; or

(b) at a price other than one shilling and elevenpence one halfpenny per pound for first grade butterfat, one shilling and ninepence one halfpenny per pound for second grade butterfat and one shilling and sevenpence one halfpenny per pound for third grade butterfat.

2. (1) No butter manufacturer shall sell salted creamery butter at a price other than—

(a) two shillings and threepence per pound for first grade butter;

(b) two shillings and one penny one farthing per second grade butter;

(c) one shilling and elevenpence per pound for third grade butter.

(2) No butter manufacturer shall sell unsalted creamery butter at a price other than—

(a) two shillings and threepence one farthing per pound for first grade butter;

(b) two shillings and one penny one farthing per pound for second grade butter;

(c) one shilling and elevenpence one farthing per pound for third grade butter.

3. (1) No person shall sell salted or unsalted creamery butter at a price exceeding—

(a) two shillings and fivepence per pound for first grade butter;

(b) two shillings and threepence per pound for second grade butter;

(c) two shillings and one penny per pound for third grade butter.

(2) The prohibition imposed under sub-clause (1) of this clause shall not apply in respect of the sale of butter by a butter manufacturer.
