IMPORT CONTROL.

It is hereby notified for general information that under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *one* of the Basutoland Exportation and Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1941 (No. 4 of 1941), section *one* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Exportation and Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1939 (No. 41 of 1939), and section *one* of the Swaziland Exportation and Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1939 (No. 46 of 1939), respectively, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to amend High Commissioner's Notice No. 129 of 1946 by deleting the Schedule thereto and substituting therefor the Schedule to this Notice.

SCHEDULE.

FOOD SUPPLIES AND DISTRIBUTION.

All articles of food or drink including such as are used in the manufacture, processing and preserving of foods, *excepting*: Anchovies; beer; brandy; butter; capers (French); cassava meal and cassava flour; cassia, cloves and allspice; caviare; cheese, natural and processed; cherries, glace; chicory; chutney; confectionery; fish spreads or pastes; flavouring essences, aromatic extracts and colouring materials; fruits, dried (including dates); gelatine; gin; glucose; gravy browning; herbs; herrings, fresh, frozen, smoked, cured or processed in brine in kegs, barrels or other wooden containers, but not tinned; Instant Postum; kaffir corn and sorghums; kaffir corn malt; liqueurs; macaroni; manioc meal and manioc flour; meat extracts; meat spreads or pastes; milk, evaporated, dried whole, sweetened, condensed, roller skim and spray skim and all milk base foods; mustard; nuts, edible; olives; pepper, mace and nutmeg; pickles and sauces; potato starch; rum; sandwich spreads; soya bean flour; spaghetti; tapioca, sago and arrowroot; vinegar; whisky; wines.

JUTE.

Jute products, whether in the piece or manufactured; bags, woolpacks and pockets, whether new or second-hand made from jute, cotton, linen or any other fibre and suitable as containers for the conveyance of grain or grain products, wool, fruit, vegetables, fertilizers or coal; sewing and binding twine; paper lined jute or fibre material.

NOTE.— In terms of High Commissioner's Notice No. 14 of 1947, the above-mentioned goods are subject to import permit irrespective of the country of origin.

SOAP AND OILS.

Fatty acids; fish oils; oils and fats, animal and vegetable; oil seeds; soap and substances containing soap.

EXPLANATORY NOTES.

(1) The effect of this notice is to amend the previous list of articles requiring import permits. Goods not shown in the above Schedule, including the *exceptions* appearing under the heading Food Supplies and Distribution, may be imported without permits previously required under these regulations.

(2) It should be noted that it is required by the Customs Department that importers who claim admission of permit-free goods must make and subscribe to the following certificate on the Customs Bill of Entry: "I certify that the goods marked X are not subject to import permit. (Signature)"

IMPORTANT NOTES.

Certificates of Essentiality for the importation of the following quota goods from the United Kingdom are still required and applications therefor should be submitted as heretofore:—

1. Leather.
2. Terneplate and Tinplate.
3. Cotton goods (piece goods, yarns, threads)..
