PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER
Entitled the Basutoland Trading (Amendment)
Proclamation, 1947.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Basutoland Trading Proclamation, 1928, hereinafter referred to as "the principal law":

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The following section, numbered *eighteen* New section 18A of Proclamation No. 28 of 1928. A, is hereby inserted immediately after section *eighteen* of the principal law:—

"18A. No owner of a dairy herd shall keep a herd of more than twenty-five cows in a Government Reserve without the written permission of the District Officer in charge of the District in which the Government Reserve is situated."

2. The Second Schedule to the principal law, as amended by Proclamation No. 19 of 1932 and Proclamation No. 44 of 1941, is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following items:— Amendment of Second Schedule of Proclamation No. 28 of 1928.

"(22) Owner of a dairy herd kept in a Government Reserve, in respect of milk, cream and butter or any one of such dairy products sold by him or on his behalf—

(a) Where such herd does not exceed 5 cows: 10s.

(b) Where such herd exceeds 5 but does not exceed 10 cows: £2.

(c) Where such herd exceeds 10 but does not exceed 25 cows: £5.

(d) Where such herd exceeds 25 cows: £10.

(23) Owner of a dairy herd kept outside Basutoland, in respect of milk, cream and butter or any one of such dairy products sold within Basutoland by him or on his behalf: £5."

3. This Proclamation may be cited as the ^{Short}
Basutoland Trading (Amendment) Proclama-
tion, 1947.
