

## SWAZILAND.

No. 7 OF 1947.

(Promulgated 24th January, 1947.)

### PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER  
Intituled the Swaziland Special Levy (Trypanosomiasis)  
Proclamation, 1947.

Whereas it is expedient to impose for a limited period a special tax on Natives of Swaziland for the purpose of meeting expenditure incurred in connection with the campaign against bovine trypanosomiasis;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers, authorities and jurisdiction conferred upon and committed to me by His Majesty under the Swaziland Order in Council, 1903, as amended by the Swaziland Order in Council, 1906, and the Swaziland Order in Council, 1909, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The High Commissioner may, by Notice in the *Gazette*, impose annually a levy, not exceeding twenty shillings, on every adult male Native domiciled in Swaziland. The levy shall become due and payable at such rate (not exceeding twenty shillings) and on such date as may be ordered by the High Commissioner by Notice in the *Gazette*.

2. The proceeds derived from the said levy shall be paid to the Swaziland Administration.

3. Subject to variation as to due date of payment of the levy, the provisions of the Swaziland Native Tax Proclamation, 1916 (No. 1 of 1916), as amended, shall be deemed to apply *mutatis mutandis* to the collection of any levy imposed in terms of section one of this Proclamation: Provided that no Native shall be liable to pay more than the amount prescribed in the Notice imposing the levy by reason of having more than one wife by native custom.

Short title. 4. This Proclamation may be cited as the  
Swaziland Special Levy (Trypanosomiasis)  
Proclamation, 1947.
