PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner

Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Further Appropriation (1945/1946) Proclamation, 1948.

Whereas it is expedient to make further provision out of the public revenue and other funds of the Bechuanaland Protectorate to meet certain additional expenditure incurred during the financial year ended on the thirty-first day of March, 1946.

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The public revenue and other funds of the Bechuanaland Protectorate are hereby charged with a further sum of £82,845. 19s. 2d. (eighty-two thousand eight hundred and forty-five pounds nineteen shillings and twopence) to meet expenditure incurred during the financial year which ended on the thirty-first day of March, 1946, in excess of the amounts appropriated for the service of that year, according to the particulars set forth in the Schedule to this Proclamation.
