PROCLAMATION

By HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER
Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Police
(Amendment) Proclamation, 1948.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Police Proclamation, 1937 (No. 69 of 1937), as amended by the Bechuanaland Protectorate Police (Amendment) Proclamation, 1947 (No. 74 of 1947).

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Section *one* is hereby amended by deleting the definition of "Police Cadet" and substituting therefor the following definition:—

"Junior Sub-Inspector" means any European member of the Force under the age of 20 years.

2. Sub-section (1) of section *four* is hereby amended by deleting the word "Commissioner" where it occurs in the sixth and seventh lines and substituting therefor the words "Resident Commissioner".

3. Section *five* is hereby amended by deleting the words "Police Cadets" and substituting therefor the words "Junior Sub-Inspectors".

4. Section *six* is hereby amended by deleting the word "Commissioner" in the first and second lines thereof and substituting therefor the words "Resident Commissioner".

5. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Police (Amendment) Proclamation, 1948, and shall have force and take effect from the fifth day of July, 1948.
