

## BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

### PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER

Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Medical,  
Dental and Pharmacy (Further Amendment)  
Proclamation, 1948.

Whereas it is expedient further to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Medical, Dental and Pharmacy Proclamation, 1934 (No. 62 of 1934), hereinafter referred to as the "principal law";

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Section *ten* of the principal law is here-  
by amended—
- (a) by the deletion of sub-sections (1) and  
(3) and the substitution therefor of the  
following sub-sections:—

"(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Proclamation, any person not registered as a chemist, carrying on the business of a general dealer within the Territory, may, subject to the provisions of this section, sell such crude drugs and proprietary medicines as he is authorised by the Director of Medical Services to sell, in accordance with sub-section (3) of this section.

(3) Every general dealer desiring to sell crude drugs or proprietary medicines under the provisions of sub-section (1), shall first obtain written authority from the Director of Medical Services to do so, which authority shall be annexed to his general dealer's licence and any renewal thereof"; and

(b) by the substitution of the words "Director of Medical Services" for the words "Principal Medical Officer" in sub-section (4).

Short title and Commencement. 2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Medical, Dental and Pharmacy (Further Amendment) Proclamation, 1948, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
