

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 105 OF 1949.

It is hereby notified for general information that, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Bechuanaland Protectorate Dairies and Dairy Produce Regulation, published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 53 of 1941, the Resident Commissioner, with the approval of the High Commissioner, has been pleased to amend High Commissioner's Notice No. 25 of 1949 as follows:—

By substituting the following for clauses 5 and 6 of Schedule B which amendment shall be deemed to have been operative as from the first day of May, 1949.

CHEESE PRICES.

5. (1) No cheese manufacturer or farm-cheese maker shall sell cheese of the Cheddar type—

(a) in quantities of twelve pounds or more at a time, at a price other than—

(i) one shilling and ninepence per pound in the case of first grade cheese; or

(ii) one shilling and eightpence per pound in the case of second grade cheese; or

(iii) one shilling and sixpence per pound in the case of third grade cheese;

Provided that in the case of whole uncut cheeses of whatever grade, weighing less than twelve pounds each, an amount of one penny per pound shall be added; or

(b) in quantities of less than twelve pounds at a time, at a price exceeding—

(i) two shillings per pound in the case of first grade cheese; or

(ii) one shilling and elevenpence per pound in the case of second grade cheese; or

(iii) one shilling and ninepence per pound in the case of third grade cheese.

(2) No cheese manufacturer or farm-cheese maker shall sell cheese of the Gouda type—

(a) in quantities of twelve pounds or more at a time—

(i) at a price other than one shilling and ninepence per pound in the case of first grade cheese; provided that where whole uncut first grade cheeses weighing not more than five pounds each are sold, the price shall be one shilling and tenpence per pound for such cheese; or

(ii) at a price below one shilling and fivepence or above one shilling and ninepence per pound in the case of ungraded cheese; provided that where whole uncut ungraded cheeses weighing not more than five pounds each are sold, the price may be more than herein stated but shall not exceed one shilling and tenpence per pound for such cheese; or

(b) in quantities of less than twelve pounds at a time at a price exceeding one shilling and elevenpence per pound for such cheese.

6. (1) No person shall sell cheese—

(a) of the Cheddar type at a price exceeding—

(i) two shillings per pound in the case of first grade cheese; or

(ii) one shilling and elevenpence per pound in the case of second grade cheese; or

(iii) one shilling and ninepence per pound in the case of third grade cheese;

provided that in the case of a whole uncut cheese of whatever grade, weighing less than twelve pounds, an amount not exceeding one penny per pound may be added;

(b) of the Gouda type at a price exceeding two shillings per pound; provided that in the case of a whole uncut cheese weighing not more than five pounds, an amount not exceeding one penny per pound may be added.

(2) The provisions of this section shall not apply to cheese manufacturers or farm-cheese makers.
